

IT IS THE POLICY OF THE WCSA TO MAKE ALLOWANCE FOR ALL PEOPLE TO SHOW THEIR ABILITY.



Assisted Shooters

Assisted Shooters (1)

- An Assisted shooter is defined as a person who is physically incapable of shooting in accordance with the general rules of shooting.
- It is the duty of the individual's governing Federation to ensure that the entry is valid.
- An Assisted Shooter shall sit to shoot and use the approved stand to support the bow.
- The seat shall not provide support above the shoulders.
- The seat shall not have arms.
- An Assisted Shooter is permitted an assistant to span and load the bow and act as an agent.





Assisted Shooters (3)

Assistants MAY

- Span and load the bow.
- Spot bolts in the target for the purposes of calling a bouncer or a pass-through.
- Change the sight setting if INSTRUCTED to do so by the shooter.
- Score and draw bolts on behalf of the shooter.
- Witness other shooters scores on behalf of the shooter they assist – act as an agent.

Assisted Shooters (3a)

Assistants SHALL

Step back 2 metres once the bow is loaded.

Assistants SHALL NOT

- Speak to the shooter during the end.
- Place more than one foot over the shooting line.
- Inform the shooter of the position of bolts in the target until after the end is complete.
- Interfere in any way with other shooters.



Shooting Procedure





SPECIAL CONDITIONS?

- For Assisted Shooters it is always inclement weather.
- Many will not have the advantage of movement to maintain body temperature.
- Consideration must be given for space on the shooting line and, where possible, how close they are to toilet facilities. This is for the organisers to arrange.
- Consideration must be given to the needs to take medication. Shooters generally will ensure that this is not a problem.
