These details are required no later than 25 January 2011 to ensure that the bulk Ministerial Import Permit is received in time. Late entrants are advised that any crossbows brought into Australia which are not on the Bulk Import Permit will require the issuing of a separate SA Police Form B709B. A separate B710 Customs Form will need to be issued to cover confiscated items. This process can take up to 6 weeks.

Competitors are advised to carry with them:

- A copy of the World Championships invitation
- A copy of the Australian Customs & Border Protection Service Ministerial Permit (Import Permit) which includes details of your name and crossbows.
